Nonprofits First and the Children's Services Council of Palm Beach County have come together to create a single modern website serving the entire Palm Beach area to help the nonprofit community assess, respond, and recover from the COVID-19 pandemic. NonprofitsFirstCares.org is designed to engage the Palm Beach County nonprofit sector in COVID-19 response and recovery and drive volunteers to where they are needed and connect donors and funders to the causes that matter most to them, and the community.

The platform is free to volunteers and nonprofits, underwritten by the nonprofit technology organization Inspiring Service and Children's Services Council of Palm Beach County and with generous support from the Great Charity Challenge.

As we learn more about how to stay healthy during the COVID-19 pandemic and organizations begin to welcome their staff back to the workplace, Nonprofits First continues to update our resources based on recommendations from health experts, local and state government, CDC, and Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA). # Healthy Return to the Workplace FAQs

OSHA is asking employers to investigate and record cases of COVID-19 that their employees acquired at work. In addition, OSHA has modified some of their language

Lab 24 is a Molecular Diagnostic Lab in South Florida currently working with the Federal Government through the Cares Act to conduct Corona (Covid-19) Virus testing Free of

Charge for patients that do not have health insurance, or that are Medicare recipients. Lab 24 is FDA EUA Approved and CLIA Certified with a 48 hour turnover time.

#### Local YMCAs Partner with PBC Parks and Rec to Provide Summer Day Camp

YMCA of the Palm Beaches and YMCA of South Palm Beach County have announced a partnership with Palm Beach County Parks and Recreation to expand summer day camp offerings and locations in an initiative to meet the increased need from parents who are returning to work. YMCA-led programs will be held now through August 7, Monday - Friday 8 am to 6 pm at three Palm Beach County Parks and Recreation facilities.

YMCA of the Palm Beaches will lead summer day camp programs at the West Jupiter Park and Recreation Center located at 6401 Indiantown Rd. in Jupiter and Westgate Park and Recreation Center located at 3691 Oswego Ave. in West Palm Beach. YMCA of South Palm Beach County will lead a summer day camp program at West Boynton Park and Recreation Center located at 6000 Northtree Blvd. in Lake Worth.

Children ages 5-12 will participate in regularly scheduled physical and educational activities which will promote a healthy lifestyle and academic enrichment.

Both Palm Beach County YMCAs continue to work closely with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the American Camp Association to ensure all camp programs and services are operated safely under their guidance, as well as Florida's reopening framework and protocols.



# **Food for Kids**

The Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) administered by Palm Beach County Youth Services is increasing the number food distribution locations. Beginning Monday, June 15, 13 more sites will be operating throughout Palm Beach County. The full list of food distribution sites may be viewed <u>here.</u>

The SFSP provides meals and snacks to eligible children age 18 and under during the summer months (June through August) and in times of emergency. Meals and snacks are also available to persons with disabilities, over age 18, who participate in school programs for people who are mentally or physically disabled. Youth Services administers and monitors this program, funded by USDA and the Department of Education. Sites are located throughout Palm Beach County in low-income neighborhoods.

# **CARES Restart Business Grants Program Offered From Palm Beach County**

The Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners (BCC) approved the CARES Restart Business Grants Program to accelerate the reopening of businesses hardest hit by COVID-19. The \$60 million Business Restart Program uses a portion of the county's \$261 million allocation from the Federal CARES Act approved by Congress. The BCC has dedicated \$50 million toward businesses with 25 or fewer employees and \$10 million towards businesses with greater than 25 employees.

Palm Tran Fixed Route and Paratransit Resumes Regular Service

• A mask or facial covering is required to ride Palm Tran. The number onboard is limited to no more than 20 passengers on fixed-route buses. PT Connection is now running non-essential trips.

# **Go Glades Service**

• Palm Tran's western community bus service, Go Glades, Routes 1, 2, 3 and 4 are currently not running a regular service. You will be able to book a trip directly to and from your destination by calling: (561) 649-9838.

• The Palm Tran call center (561) 841-4BUS (4287) is operating from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Many trip planning functions may be done through the Palm Tran app and on palmtran.org.

# Tri-Rail

• Passengers are urged to wear masks while riding. Tri-Rail continues to offer an amended schedule until further notice, with 18-trains every 2 hours starting at 4:17 a.m. on weekdays, and 12-trains every 3-hours starting at 5:17 a.m. on weekends. Trains have suspended fares.

# Libraries

The Palm Beach County Library System is offering some evening and Saturday hours. All locations are closed on Sunday. Visitors are required to wear facial covers. A limited number of computers will be available with social distancing measures in place. Computer users are limited to a 1 hour computer session per day. Returned materials will be quarantined for 72 hours. Members are asked to return items through the book drop or automated returns and to place items removed from shelves on book carts for quarantine.
