Council declares January Mentoring Awareness Month

While the number of Palm Beach County children waiting for a mentor has decreased 23 percent from last year, more than 830 children remain on the wait list seeking the friendship and guidance of a trusted adult. In Palm Beach County, about 5,000 children are assigned to mentors through the United Way of Palm Beach County's Mentor Center. William A. Cruickshank Scholarship

In March, the Palm Beach League of Cities' Scholarship Committee will award deserving high school seniors and municipal employees. Students planning a course of study in public service and employees continuing their educations in their fields are eligible. The Cruickshank Scholarship program provides scholarships of up to \$1,000* for expenses associated with academic endeavors to qualified high school seniors and expense stipends for municipal employees pursuing continuing education in these fields. School Bus Safety and Legislative Change as of Jan. 1, 2021

Florida school buses carry precious cargo - our children. Motorists should always be alert and drive with caution around school buses and in school zones where children may be present like schools, bus stops, school buses and school parking lots. As of January 1, 2021, Florida Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles announced penalties for failure to stop for a school bus double. The penalty for failure to stop for a school bus goes from a minimum \$100 to \$200 and if a second offense is committed in 5
