The Councils for the Common Good in Lincoln Park, Overtown and Wimauma continue to move forward in addressing community priorities through specific strategies. In Lincoln Park, a community survey garnering information for strategy implementation was recently completed. In Overtown, a RFP was launched in support of the priority, "Community Voices Inform Policies and Decisions." The Wimauma Council is working to create a permanent home for La Esperanza Clinic.
