In the fall of 2020, United Way of Palm Beach County received at \$10 million gift from MacKenzie Scott. After working with a consultant to do extensive research, interviewing local leaders, and seeking input from the community, we identified two areas that funding was urgently needed in our community: ongoing hunger relief efforts and a better system of supports for veterans.

The overall goal of the MacKenzie Scott funds for the Hunger Relief Initiative is to alleviate hunger in the shortterm while also promoting Palm Beach County residents' self-sufficiency in the long-term.
