


## Remembering Estelle Friedman


Advocacy Committee Volunteers Needed by Debra Chandler

Local League of Women Voters Partners with Solar United Neighbors to Virtually Launch Palm Beach County Solar Co-op on Jan. 14



(West Palm Beach, FL – December 22, 2020) The League of Women Voters of Palm Beach County (LWVPBC) is partnering with Solar United Neighbors (SUN) to launch the Palm Beach County Solar Co-op on January 14 to help Palm Beach County residents

go solar.

"The co-op will enable Palm Beach County homeowners and business owners to join the growing community of people saving money by harnessing solar power," said Laura Tellez, South Florida program coordinator for SUN. "Together, we're building a movement to transform our electricity system into one that is cleaner, fairer, and shares its benefits more broadly."

The co-op is free to join and open to homeowners and business owners in Palm Beach County. Together, co-op members will learn about solar energy and leverage bulk purchasing to ensure competitive pricing and quality solar installations.

After a competitive bidding process facilitated by Solar United Neighbors, co-op members will select a single solar company to complete the installations. Joining the co-op does not obligate members to purchase solar. Instead, members will have the option to individually purchase panels and electric vehicle chargers based on the installer's group rate.

Solar United Neighbors has hosted 60 solar co-ops in Florida since 2015. According to the group's estimates, the 1,800 homes and businesses that now have solar panels because of co-ops represent: 17+ MW of solar power, \$39.2 million in local solar spending, and more than 585 million lbs. of lifetime carbon offsets.

Solar United Neighbors will host several free information sessions to educate community members about solar energy and the co-op. # Netherlands – Palm Beach Election Connection by Pam Maldonado



Nothing in my previous life prepared me to be involved in making videos. I was a pediatric ICU nurse, stay-at-home mom and eventually worked in property management. But being active in the League gives you the opportunity to grow and learn all sorts of new skills.

In September, out of the blue, we were contacted by a freelance video producer named Shea Elmore, who lives in Amsterdam. He offered to donate his services to help produce Get Out the Vote videos for us. To say we were gobsmacked would be putting it lightly!

Shea's initial email included scripts for three possible 15-second videos, and was quickly followed by story boards to illustrate his ideas.

Of course, our first question was how to cover the costs of production and marketing the videos on YouTube. League member, attorney Salesia Smith-Gordon, a dynamo in high heels, offered to make a personal donation and then obtained the remaining funds the Palm Beach Justice Association and attorney Byrnes Guillaume. We had the money we needed!

Our team of Salesia, Ken Horkavy, Shea and I worked on finalizing scripts and picture selection. Voiceovers were done by Shea, Salesia's husband Lawrence Gordon, and her multi-cultural, multi-generational office staff. Spanish and Creole subtitles were added so that anyone who had subtitles activated on their cell phones would see the text in their language.

The videos went up on YouTube and were viewed around 15,000 times, although we had hoped for even more. Increased activity from political campaigns as Election Day approached boosted the per view price tremendously, depleting our funds faster than anticipated. That's a lesson learned for next time! The videos do not contain anything that dates them, so we will be able to use them again earlier next election cycle.

We are so grateful to Shea, Salesia, Byrnes and the Justice Association for partnering with us on this very exciting undertaking. We look forward to working with them again in the future.
