### **Plan Ahead**

Being pulled over because of an expired registration means a \$116 ticket. Plan ahead to avoid this unnecessary expense. Many of our most popular transactions — like motor vehicle registration renewals – can be done online. You can renew up to 3 months before expiration. Save additional time with the "Renew for 2" program, which allows vehicle owners to renew every two years.

Don't get caught off guard with a suspended or revoked license. Unpaid traffic tickets and failure to pay child support among other reasons, may result in a suspension/revocation of your driver license. #### **Prepare for Hurricane Season**

Hurricane season begins June 1st. Last October, Hurricane Matthew reminded us of how threatening these natural disasters can be. Preparation is key to keeping our neighborhoods, communities and families safe. Follow these tips to prepare in the event of a hurricane.

Before the storm:

- Purchase supplies for your Family Disaster Supplies Kit.
- Do all major cutting / tree removal from December through April.

- Create an evacuation plan for you and your family.

Drivers should give bikes a minimum three foot buffer when driving alongside or passing. If there is a motorcycle ahead, do not follow too closely. Motorcycles can stop quicker than other vehicles.
