### Palm Beach County Community Services Offers Air Conditioning Replacement Program to Homeowners

The crisis Heating Ventilation and Air Conditioning (HVAC) Replacement Program, through LIHEAP (Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program), is working to assist low-income Palm Beach County (PBC) homeowners in need of replacing their home's HVAC system, with assistance of up to \$15,000. This money can be used to replace their home cooling system.

Clients must be income eligible, live in Palm Beach County, and are required to show that they are in a crisis situation. Completed applications must show one or more of the following:

- The HVAC system no longer cools
- HVAC unit is 10 years or older
- Proof of high energy bills
- Proof of life threatening environment via a doctor's statement

#### **Do you own or work for a local HVAC company?**

Palm Beach County Community Services is looking to partner with HVAC companies to replace clients' outdated, inefficient, or nonfunctioning HVAC systems. Eligible clients can obtain a new HVAC system at little or no cost and the cost of the replacement is covered by the LIHEAP Program.

#### **Want to become a county HVAC partner?**

- Must have HVAC license
- Register with Palm Beach County Planning, Zoning and Building
- Must be an active vendor with Palm Beach County or sign up to become one
