This issue of our quarterly newsletter highlights remarkable agency and program accomplishments for the latter part of the fiscal year that ended on June 30, 2021. It also provides a glimpse of important developments in the first quarter of this year.

Fiscal year 2020-2021 was a highly productive year for our agency, financially, and otherwise. Thanks to the kind support of our donors and funders, we clearly exceeded our revenue goals in contributions and fundraising, and we had the highest dollar volume in grants ever. Our website continued to flourish and gain online presence, as total online donations also increased substantially. The expedited accreditation we received from the Council on Accreditation for the next four years with no critical standards out of compliance reflects the dedication and excellence of our employees and volunteers and the support and guidance from our Board of Directors. Furthermore, Catholic Charities' reputation and goodwill in the community are at a peak level, as evidenced by unrequested awards of significant funds to fight hunger and prevent homelessness during the pandemic or automatic renewal or expansion of funding in some programs for the current fiscal year.

May the Lord continue to guide us in these difficult times, with your prayers and support, in our collective effort to serve people in need and create hope in all stages of life.

This summer, Catholic Charities was blessed with several life saving donations. God's Resources, Inc. donated 2 Mercedes Sprinter mobile ultrasound vans (valued at \$150,000) to Catholic Charities knowing that we are a trusted prolife organization and that we would carry on their mission of protecting the unborn. The vans require ongoing TLC just like all new additions to a family, and the need for additional funds became apparent. Thanks to swift action by our Board of Directors, an anonymous donor stepped forward with a check for \$50,000. Hearing of the newly acquired vans and envisioning how this would grow the Respect Life Ministry, the Birthline/Lifeline Pregnancy Care Centers and the newly formed Women's Pregnancy Solutions program, Most Reverend Gerald M. Barbarito, Bishop of Palm Beach, matched the anonymous donation

with a check for \$50,000 from the Diocese of Palm Beach. We are extremely grateful to Bishop, God's Resources, Inc., our anonymous donor and all those who so graciously support our pro-life efforts. We want to be visible on all fronts, ready and able to assist them in finding the right solution. A mobile pregnancy van will get noticed and the word will get out. Then, it is the job of our counselors and staff to advise these expectant mothers that they have several options other than terminating a pregnancy. We will educate and empower women to choose life. 

signs of Trafficking

Is the person unpaid, paid very little, or paid only through tips? Does the person work excessively long and/or unusual hours? Is the person not allowed breaks or suffers under unusual restrictions at work? Does the person owe a large debt and is unable to pay it off? Was the person recruited under false promises concerning the nature and conditions of their work? Does the person live at their place of employment?


Does the person live with multiple people in a cramped space? Is the person in the commercial sex industry and do they have a pimp/manager? Is the person under the age of 18 and providing commercial sex acts? Does the person appear overly anxious, fearful, paranoid? Do they avoid eye contact? Does the person appear depressed, hopeless, exhibit self-destructive behaviors? Does the person appear to suffer from substance abuse disorders or post-traumatic stress? Is the person malnourished, exhibit untreated wounds, have older broken bones? Does the person have burn marks, bite marks, or branding tattoos?

Is the person in control or possession of their personal identification, travel documents, or money Does the person have few or no personal possessions?

If a minor, is the person enrolled in school?


