Free Breakfast and Lunch for FY23

School Food Service will be continuing to offer free breakfasts and lunches to all students in the 2022-2023 school year. While the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) waivers have not been extended, School Food Service will be operating under the USDA's CEP option.

This will mean the following for our students and our program:

- 1. Breakfast and Lunch will be available for students for free in all schools.
- 2. After-school snacks and Suppers will be available in most of our schools. We will send a list of eligible schools out shortly to your Managers so they can connect with you to see if you would like to offer snacks and/or suppers next year.
- 3. No negative balance concerns. No meal replacements!
- 4. No more Free & Reduced Price Meal Applications. SFS Central Office will still be offering income forms for parents whose students are not directly certified and need a letter to qualify for other benefits (testing, aftercare, eyeglasses, etc.). More information will follow about this so you can communicate the new process to your parents.

We are still hoping that the current USDA waivers will be extended which will allow us to continue the grab-and-go snacks that are occurring in some schools as well as the pre-holiday meal distribution. More to follow on this as we receive more information.

Community ID Events

The Community ID of the Palm Beaches is for ANY resident who may have limited access to government-issued forms of identification and for those who support a diverse and inclusive community.
