Last month, our team attended the groundbreaking ceremony for Merry Place Estates by developer PulteGroup. David Kanarek, HLC Board member and Senior Manager of Community Associations and Land Project Manager for PulteGroup's South Florida Division, kicked off the event focused on bringing workforce housing to an area undergoing revitalization. The 34 townhomes and two (2) single-family house property will be in the Pleasant City neighborhood of West Palm Beach. PulteGroup and the West Palm Beach Housing Authority, led by Executive Director and fellow HLC Board Member Laurel Robinson, agree to bring these homes to

Who Qualifies for Workforce Housing?

The 2018 Area Median Income (AMI) for Palm Beach County is \$74,300 for a family of four. The Workforce Housing Program household income ranges from \$44,580 (60% AMI) to \$104,020 (140% AMI). Actual income depends on the number of family members. If you are in this income range, you qualify for special pricing on apartments and homes.
