

Call for Sapphire Nominations

Florida Blue Foundation nominations for the 2017 Sapphire Awards are due on or before September 23, 2016. The Sapphie Awards, given annually by the Florida Blue Foundation since 2005, recognize excellence and innovation in nonprofit community health leadership and programming in Florida. Three categories of awards are available: organization, program and individual.

Sapphire Awards honorees must demonstrate leadership, success and high merit while improving health-related outcomes or access to health-related services for Florida's at-risk



populations and communities.

A total of approximately \$360,000 will be shared among the honorees (organization, program and individual categories) to continue the recognized initiatives.

Sapphire Awards honorees are an elite group first nominated through a call for applications, and then chosen by an independent panel of national experts in community health, nonprofit health and health care policy. The 2017 Sapphire Awards will be presented during lunch on April 20, 2017, as a part of the two-day Florida Blue Foundation Community Health Symposium and Sapphire Awards scheduled for April 19-20, 2017, at the Gaylord Palms Resort and

Convention Center, Kissimmee, Florida. The theme for the 2017 Florida Blue Foundation Community Health Symposium is Creating a Culture of Health.

Florida Blue and Florida Blue Foundation Respond to Zika Concerns

As Florida's health insurance leader, Florida Blue and the Florida Blue Foundation are stepping in and stepping up to ensure communities are informed and prepared when it comes to the Zika virus. This public health situation is a developing one and being monitored daily by federal, state and local health officials as well as by the public. Currently, the nation's so called "ground zero" is an area in Miami called Wynwood where non-travel-related cases of the Zika virus have been found and where a nationwide travel alert is currently in place. Yet, all of Florida is watching the situation and taking measures to protect against the spread of the virus.

As soon as health officials announced the first mosquito-transmitted cases a few weeks ago, Florida Blue engaged a team to jump into action. The company assessed the potential impact to its employees, members, providers and the community at large. The organization reached out to health officials, cities and counties, local businesses and nonprofit organizations as well as doctors and providers to see how it could take a leadership role in providing critical information to keep people safe.



Among other efforts, there are currently education sessions taking place at Florida Blue Retail Centers and at the CliniSanitas Medical Centers in Miami-Dade. There is also a new partnership established when it comes to providing insect repellant and health education materials. This newly-formed coalition of concerned agencies includes many Florida Blue Foundation grant recipients and other nonprofits supported by the company.

The Zika virus is transmitted by mosquitoes, so the best way to avoid the virus is to avoid mosquito contact. There are a variety of resources provided by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Florida Department of Health. These include information for travelers, pregnant women, doctors and other health providers as well as precautionary and informational guidance for the general public who are all advised to monitor the websites of both the CDC, <u>www.cdc.gov/zika</u> and the Florida Department of Health, <u>www.floridahealth.gov/diseases-and-conditions/zika-virus</u>. There are materials in English, Spanish and Creole. The State of Florida also has launched a Zika Virus Information Hotline, 855-622-6735. In addition, Florida Blue has updated information on its website, <u>www.floridablue.com</u>.

The protection campaign for pregnant women and the general public is centered on two key efforts - Drain and Cover.

Drain

• Once a week, drain and cover areas that contain standing water, such as tires,

buckets, planters, toys, pools, birdbaths, flowerpots or trash containers.

- Empty and clean birdbaths and pet water bowls at least once or twice a week.
- Empty plastic swimming pools when not in use.

Cover

- When going outside, the CDC and Florida Department of Health (DOH) recommend using an insect repellent containing DEET.
- Cover skin (especially children) with clothing that covers arms and legs.
- Cover cribs and strollers with mosquito netting.
- Use air conditioning when available.
- Use screens on windows and doors and repair any holes.

As long as the Zika virus remains a concern, Florida Blue and Florida Blue Foundation leaders will look for ways to support the community, members, providers and other health agencies. Please share the educational information with your clients and employees so they are prepared.

The new grant application system is now live, effective July 18. You can apply for any open grant or sponsorship opportunities. SmartSimple will ask you to register the first time that you go to the site. Each user has a unique registration, and you will be given the opportunity to review your organization's profile to make sure we have updated information.

This new portal will provide the applications for our Build Healthy, Strong Communities corporate sponsorship and Foundation grants program; our BluePartners agent matching program; our Florida Blue Foundation competitive RFP programs; and our Sapphire Awards nominations.
