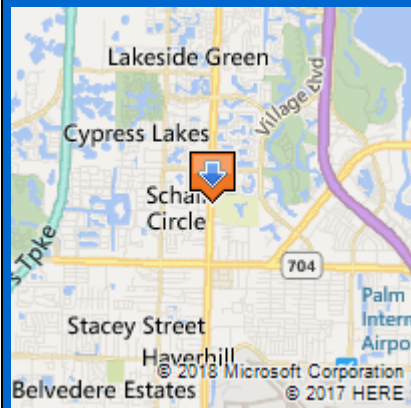

Neil W. Boris, M.D.: Dr. Boris is currently Director of the [Irving Harris Training Institute](#) at the Center for Prevention and Early Intervention Policy at Florida State University and Project Director for [Circle of Security International](#). In his 20+ years since graduating from residency at Brown University in pediatrics, adult psychiatry and child psychiatry, Dr. Boris has focused on the social and emotional development of high-risk children - including those under five years of age.

Dr. Boris' clinical work has been equally wide ranging: from involvement with programs focused on young maltreated children to children with life-threatening illnesses or those with substance-abusing parents. He attained the rank of tenured Professor at Tulane University where his passion for teaching and training was awarded with a Teaching Scholar Award. He has held several leadership positions, including being an associate editor of the *Infant Mental Health Journal* and being on the Board of Directors of the [World Association of Infant Mental Health](#).
