## **County and State Orders, Actions, and Announcements**

### **SCHOOL BOARD APPROVES AUGUST 31 START DATE**

The 2020-2021 school year will begin for students on Monday, August 31 in Palm Beach County School District-operated schools. The School Board voted unanimously on July 22 to delay the start date by three weeks. Click here for [more details](#).

### **PALM BEACH COUNTY EMERGENCY ORDERS**

On July 28, the Board of County Commissioners unanimously adopted [Emergency Ordinance 2020-013](#). The measure amends Article II of Chapter 9 of the Palm Beach County Code of Ordinances known as the Emergency Management Ordinance, which provides procedures for managing emergencies.

[Emergency Order 2020-015](#) took effect at 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, July 23, 2020. Clarifies the restriction of operating hours for restaurants, food establishments and other businesses and clarifies current businesses that remain closed and. Palm Beach County Emergency Order 2020-014 is repealed in its entirety.

[Emergency Order 2020-016](#): Extension of the facial coverings directive Emergency Order 2020-012 until 12:01 a.m. on August 23, 2020. This order was originally slated to expire on July 24, 2020.

**IMPORTANT POLICY UPDATES FROM DEPT. OF CHILDREN AND FAMILIES**

*Recertification Extension*

To ensure Floridians can safely access SNAP, TANF, and Medicaid benefits, DCF has implemented a six-month recertification extension for individuals and families scheduled to recertify in April, May, June, July and August.

*Maximum Monthly Allotment*

The Department of Children and Families worked with federal partners to temporarily increase all Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP) recipients' benefit amounts to the maximum monthly allotment based on household size; the temporary increase continues for August.

For August, households who normally receive their monthly allotment between the 1st and 10th, will receive the monthly maximum allotment on August 10th. All other clients can expect additional benefits to be included as a part of their regularly scheduled benefit allotment. Additionally, any new households approved for food assistance will receive additional benefits within a week of being approved for benefits. Please note, customers who are already receiving the maximum allotment will not receive an increase.

### Work Requirements Waiver

Governor DeSantis has directed Department of Children and Families to postpone the reinstatement of work requirements through the end of August.

Through August 31, 2020, public benefits will not be terminated for Floridians who do not comply with work requirements. The Governor will coordinate with DCF to reevaluate the implementation of work requirements in the coming months.

To be clear, if an individual has received a notification stating that they are subject to work requirements or that they may be penalized due to failure to meet work requirements, they may disregard. No action is needed by those clients and no penalties will be applied. Click [here](#) for more information and updates.

## **COMMUNITY SERVICES DEPT. PROVIDES HELP FOR RESIDENTS FACING EVICTION**

The Palm Beach County Community Services Department (CSD) has contracted with the Legal Aid Society of Palm Beach County, Inc. and Florida Rural Legal Services, Inc. to



provide county residents with free legal representation and assistance in handling landlord/tenant matters and past due payments through the Rapid Response Eviction Assistance Project (RREAP). The program is part of the CARES Act COVID-19.

Through the COVID-19 RREAP, the agencies will assist individuals who have received a three-day notice or demand for rent from their landlord, been served with an eviction lawsuit, or who need help understanding the eviction process. The services include:

- pre-suit mediation between landlords and tenants
- legal advice regarding the eviction process
- referrals for rental assistance
- preparation of responses to an eviction lawsuit
- assistance in negotiating repayment plans, and
- court representation.

The COVID-19 RREAP is designed to respond to the housing crisis created by the COVID-19 pandemic by mediating disagreements between tenants and property owners. Through this program, parties will be able to construct payment plans, temporary rent reductions, deferred payments or other creative solutions to prevent evictions and ultimately homelessness.

The program term is from Aug. 1 through Dec. 30, 2020, and participants can receive up to \$10,000 in rental assistance. Eligibility requirements for the program include:

- rental unit must be located in Palm Beach County
- tenant's income is under 140% of Area Median Income

Applicants will need documentation to qualify for the program:

- proof of U.S. Citizenship or legal residents (per CARES Act regulations)
- documentation proving hardship is directly related to the COVID-19 pandemic, such as evidence of loss of income, reduction in hours, or unemployment due to the COVID-19 pandemic that contributed to the missed rental payments, and
- an eviction notice (three-day notice or 30-day notice for CARES Act covered parties);

#### **Highridge Family Center Provides Free Intensive Outpatient Program and Supervised Distance Learning for Palm Beach County Youth**

Beginning August 31, Palm Beach County Youth Services Department's Highridge Family Center is offering an ongoing five-days-per-week Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP) for youth ages 11-16, who are experiencing mental health or behavioral concerns and need more intensive supervision than at-home distance learning may provide.

In addition to licensed clinicians providing therapeutic services, Highridge staff offers structured and supervised distance learning, recreational and creative activities



throughout the day. The program is free of charge for Palm Beach County residents. Family therapy and group therapy are required components of the program.

Daily programming is from 7:15 am to 6:30 pm Monday-Thursday and 7:15 am to 1 pm on Fridays. Families are responsible for daily transportation.

The IOP includes the following schedule of activities:

- Breakfast (provided)
- Distance learning with Palm Beach County Public Schools
- Lunch (provided)
- Therapeutic group
- Outdoor structured activity
- Community group or group activity and homework
- Dinner (provided)
- Pick-up

Highridge Family Center follows CDC guidelines for social distancing, handwashing and face coverings (provided). YFC licensed clinical social workers, licensed mental health counselors, and masters-level therapists can help families by addressing the following areas:

- school and behavioral concerns

- emotion regulation
- grief
- loneliness
- parent-child relationships
- adjustment/anxiety to virtual school
- communication and social skills

**Meals on Wheels of the Palm Beaches**

Due to COVID-19 Meals on Wheels has temporarily adjusted operations to ensure the continued health and safety of the vulnerable senior population they serve, as well volunteers many of whom are over 60 themselves. They have shifted from daily deliveries to once a week delivery of a multi-pack of frozen dinner meals along with three breakfast meals.
