Connect with families who have had been affected by overdose, or are at high risk for overdose.

Hanley Foundation, a statewide leader in substance use disorder prevention, education, and advocacy for access to quality treatment, recently announced the launch of Project C₄OPE, a program designed to connect families who share the experience of a loved one who has died of opioid overdose, survived an overdose, or are at high risk for overdose. Palm Beach County leads the state in opioid-related overdose deaths, with more than 600 recorded in 2017 alone and more than 5,000 total opioid overdoses recorded in 2016.

Families in the opioid crisis from across Palm Beach County are invited to connect each week at 4 different locations around Palm Beach County May through Sept. 2018.
