2017-2018 Funding opportunity for rural communities through Volunteer Florida

Volunteer Florida's Rural Community Assets Fund (RCAF) allows grantees to recruit, equip and mobilize volunteers in eligible rural areas across the state to address the educational needs of underserved children and youth in early childhood education settings and within the K-12 education system. RCAF is open to any community or faith-based organization that maintains 501(c)(3) nonprofit status, or government entity in Florida. Volunteer Florida will distribute a total of \$100,000 through the Rural Community Assets Fund. Respondents may request between \$5,000 and \$10,000 and must provide a 25% cash or in-kind match. Grantees will receive funding as well as training and support for their participation in the program. Proposals are due by **5 p.m. on Wednesday, June 21, 2017**.
