The Clerk of the Circuit Court & Comptroller's annual Operation Green Light event is March 28 through April 1. Operation Green Light started with our office in 2014 and has since been adopted by Clerk's offices statewide. During the event, anyone with outstanding traffic tickets or other court fines and fees will have their collection agency fees waived. The original fine and any late fees must still be paid.
