ACHIEVE Out-of-School Time Incentive Award Program



August 15 is the last day to submit an ACHIEVE Out-of-School Time (OST) application for the next supplement in September.

Do not submit an application if you received an ACHIEVE OST incentive in June.

ACHIEVE OST is a tiered incentive award program that is offered to members of Prime Time's Quality

Improvement System that rewards practitioners for participating in trainings and earning certificates and degrees, with an emphasis on best practices in youth development. ACHIEVE OST is designed to increase afterschool program stability and improve program quality by reducing staff turnover and encouraging afterschool practitioners to continue their training and education. Children and youth benefit from continuous care from practitioners who are specialists in the out-of-school-time field, understand best practices in youth development and are sensitive to their needs.

Do you want to get your 40-Hour School Age Certification?

The 40-Hour School-Age Certification program prepares students who work with children five years and up in a licensed afterschool program. Part I includes topics covering local rules and regulations; identifying and reporting child abuse and neglect; health, safety and nutrition; and school-age appropriate practices. Part II will introduce the participant to a specialized school age curriculum focused on the stages of development for children ages five and up.
