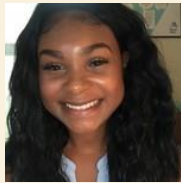

Recent studies have found that African Americans are twice as likely to develop Alzheimer's disease, and Hispanic/Latinx one and a half times more likely. Studies are now exploring the risk factors which may contribute to these findings, including healthcare disparities and race-based traumatic stress.

- The intersectionality of race and trauma
