


Habitat for Humanity of Palm Beach County Announces Kelly Smallridge will serve as Honorary Chair of Women Build 2022

#### Glades Area History

In September 1994, Boys & Girls Clubs of Palm Beach County proposed an outreach and partnership program to all of the Glades' area schools. By December, an agreement was reached for the Club to assume the operation of the afterschool programs in three elementary schools in Belle Glade. Over the years, the Glades area Boys & Girls Club grew to encompass six school-based sites and one standalone facility serving more than 3,000 youth through programs and outreach.


