

CareerSource Palm Beach County Office Reopens in Belle Glade Tues. Sept. 19

West Palm Beach, Fla. (Sept. 18, 2017) – CareerSource Palm Beach County’s West Career Center at 1085 S. Main Street in Belle Glade reopens Tuesday, Sept. 19 at 8:00 a.m. with all services available. The office had been closed due to damage from Hurricane Irma.

CareerSource Palm Beach County’s Central Career Center and the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Employment & Training Office remain open at 3400 Belvedere Road in West Palm Beach. Regular business hours for all offices are from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday-Friday.

Full services for career seekers include classes and facilities for job search, career development and consulting; and grants for job skills training. Services for employers include recruitment, assessments and referrals of qualified job candidates; space and staff assistance for screening/interviewing candidates; and grants for training employees. Post- Irma employment assistance: CareerSource Palm Beach County is part of a statewide network connecting employers with the talent they need to rebuild their businesses and assisting residents who are unemployed as a result of Hurricane Irma find new employment.

To assist Floridians in their recovery efforts after Hurricane Irma and ensure benefits are timely received, the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) has notified all CareerSource organizations throughout the state, including CareerSource Palm Beach County, that they will not require Reemployment Assistance and Disaster Unemployment Assistance recipients to register for work in the Employ Florida jobs database or submit weekly work search records for all of September. In addition, sanctions are suspended for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Employment & Training Program and the Welfare Transition Program for all of September.

“We are here to help rebuild our employment and economic infrastructure following this tragic storm,” Mr. Craig said. “We are working with businesses to provide the talent they need to recover and be successful.
