TAXES FILED FREE PROGRAM

United Way of Palm Beach County has partnered with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) to provide free, confidential, and secure preparation and e-filing of tax returns to qualified taxpayers. To qualify, taxpayer's income must have been \$70,000 or less in 2022. You may be eligible for up to \$6,935 in Earned Income Tax Credits (EITC). Taxes Filed Free service gives you two options to choose from to e-file your tax return. All options are supported by IRS-Certified Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) volunteers.

Filed For You – Face-to-face tax preparation provided at several county sites. No appointment needed

Filed Yourself – Visit www.MyFreeTaxes.com and file your own tax return. It's simple, fast and secure. Support is available via toll-free helpline or web chat
