## **Tell Trump Administration to Keep Hands Off SNAP**

Food assistance for the hungry shouldn't have a time limit. Yet, the Trump Administration has <u>proposed a rule</u> that would take away SNAP eligibility for 755,000 unemployed and underemployed adults. That means cutting SNAP food benefits by \$15 billion over 10 years. This would make hunger and poverty in this country far, far worse.
