The governing board of Children's Services Council of Palm Beach County on Thursday voted to reduce the 2021-2022 millage rate to .6233 – a four-percent decrease from last year. The Council's property tax revenue will remain the same despite the reduction, allowing the Council to meet the needs of the community in innovative ways.
